2010 Summer Recreation Program Registration Information

The Summer Camp Program is for children who are presently in grades K-7. Children who are presently in grade 8 may apply as a CIT (see CIT blurb on next page for further information).

Registration maximum is 900 campers.

All rates have remained the same as the 2009 Summer Program!

FUNDAMENTALS OF THE MANALAPAN SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM

Location and Length

All of the camp groups are centrally located at the Manalapan Recreation Center directly across from the Municipal Building on Route 522. The Recreation Center is conducive for a variety of activities for the campers while maintaining effective supervision. Local schools are used in the event of inclement weather. The program runs from Wed. June 30 through Friday, August 13 (no program July 5).

Organization

For effective management and organization, the camp groups are divided into three Clusters. Cluster 1 includes all campers in grades kindergarten through second grade. Cluster 2 includes all campers in grades three through five. Cluster 3 includes all campers in grades six and seven. Each grade is also subdivided into several smaller groups each headed by a Group Supervisor. The Group Supervisor positions are filled by either adults with teaching experience or upper classmen in college with significant experience as a summer camp employee. To assist with visibility and management, each group will be assigned a specific colored T-shirt.

Trips

Our vision includes a focus on bringing a high quality experience to the campers at the Recreation Center. Campers in Cluster 1 and 2 will have the opportunity to register for five "major" trips. Cluster 3 campers (6/7th grade) will have the opportunity to register for more than fifteen trips throughout the camp season. All trips require additional payment and registration (per trip). Trip registration available in April.

Swimming

With parental consent, campers in all grades will be bussed to local pools for the opportunity to swim approximately twice each week (1st and 7th week excluded). The swim trips do not require any additional registration fee.

8th Grade and the Counselor In Training (CIT) Program

There is no regular eighth grade camper program. Eighth graders who wish to be a part of the program must apply to be a member of the CIT program. We will be accepting a maximum of 40 CITs this year. Applications are available at WWW.MTNJ.ORG. Application cut-off is Friday, March 26th.

After Care Service Available

To offer parents an option of picking up their children later than the normal dismissal time (2:45-3:00pm), an administrator and a group of After Care counselors are available from 3:00-4:30pm every camp day. For an additional registration fee, parents can choose to register their children for the entire seven week After Care program. Alternatively, parents can make selective use of the After Care program at a daily rate of \$8. Please note that the daily rate applies any time a camper is picked up after 3:00pm. No transportation (bus service) home is provided with after care options.

Dress Code:

All campers must wear their group colored T-shirt every day to camp. In addition, campers must wear sneakers every day so that they may safely participate in the scheduled activities.

Campers not in compliance will be sent home.
